2	Wed 11/11/2026	Transfer to and guided tour of Matsumoto	This morning, board the shinkansen (bullet train) followed by a scenic express train ride to Matsumoto, nestled in the foothills of the Japan Alps in Nagano Prefecture. Once a strategic castle town during Japan's feudal era, Matsumoto is now known for its relaxed, cultured atmosphere, impressive alpine backdrop, and thriving local arts scene. On arrival, visit one of Japan's most treasured historic landmarks - Matsumoto Castle, the oldest surviving wooden castle in the country and one of only five designated National Treasure Castles. With its striking black-and-white exterior and beautifully preserved interiors, the castle offers a fascinating glimpse into samurai-era Japan. You'll have the chance to climb to the top of the turret and enjoy panoramic views of the city and surrounding mountains. Later, enjoy a guided stroll through the charming historic streets of Matsumoto before gathering with your fellow travellers for a special "Welcome to Japan" dinner at a local restaurant. 3	Thu 12/11/2026	Guided tour of Kamikochi	This morning, travel by private minibus into the heart of the Japan Alps to reach one of the country's most breathtaking natural settings - Kamikochi, whose name means "where the gods descend." Surrounded by dramatic peaks over 3,000 metres high, this remote alpine valley is a true highlight of the tour - especially in the vibrant colours of autumn. Enjoy a leisurely guided walk along elevated boardwalks and forest trails that wind through clear mountain streams, mossy ponds, and untouched beech and birch forests cloaked in brilliant autumn foliage. The peaceful landscape, mirrored in still waters, invites reflection and awe. Tonight, stay in a comfortable mountain lodge nestled in the valley. Your private room includes a toilet, while bathing is in the hotel's communal bath, a traditional feature of mountain stays in Japan. In the evening, enjoy a generous buffet dinner featuring seasonal local produce, served in a relaxed, casual atmosphere. 4	Fri 13/11/2026	Guided tour of Shinano Omachi	After your refreshing nature walks in Kamikochi, today offers a more relaxed pace as you continue travelling by private minibus toward Shinano Omachi, the gateway to the spectacular Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route. Though small, the town offers delightful surprises - traditional architecture, local crafts, and a peaceful, timeworn atmosphere.		
			For lunch, enjoy a local specialty noodle dish at a quaint, locally loved restaurant - a perfect taste of the region.		
			Tonight, unwind at a well-appointed alpine resort hotel, featuring comfortable Western-style rooms, an onsen bath, and even an indoor pool - ideal for relaxing and rejuvenating before tomorrow's alpine adventure.

			By late afternoon, you'll arrive in Toyama City, located on the coast of the Japan Sea. The evening is yours to relax or explore - a perfect chance to sample Toyama's celebrated regional cuisine, including fresh local seafood and excellent sake from the region's famed breweries.		
6	Sun 15/11/2026	Guided tour of Kurobe Gorge	This morning, board the charming "Torokko Train" for a ride through the dramatic beauty of Kurobe Gorge, Japan's deepest river valley. Originally built to transport workers constructing the massive Kurobe Dam, this nostalgic narrow-gauge railway now offers one of Japan's most scenic journeys - especially stunning in autumn.	Breakfast, Dinner	Unazuki Onsen Enraku [Japanese style room with futon beddings and view of Kurobe Gorge]
			The open-air vintage carriages wind through steep ravines, over trestle bridges, and past waterfalls and forests ablaze with vibrant autumn leaves. Along the way, you'll disembark for a walk along the gorge, where you'll breathe in the crisp mountain air and capture striking photos of the colourful, rugged landscape.		
			In the evening, check in to a traditional Japanese ryokan in Unazuki Onsen, a quiet hot spring town nestled in the mountains. After a relaxing soak in the onsen bath, enjoy a beautifully presented kaiseki dinner, a refined multi-course meal showcasing the best of seasonal local ingredients.

7	Mon 16/11/2026	Guided tour of Shogawa Valley and Gokayama	After breakfast, you travel by private minibus through the vibrant mountain landscape to the breathtaking Shogawa Valley, where the slopes are ablaze with autumn colours. To fully appreciate the scale and serenity of the landscape, enjoy a peaceful river cruise along the Shogawa River, gliding past sheer cliffs and hillsides cloaked in fiery foliage. 			Next, visit Inami, a town renowned for its exquisite wood-carving tradition that dates back to the 17th century. At the local wood-carving centre, watch skilled artisans at work, transforming blocks of wood into detailed sculptures. Then, see these techniques brought to life at Zuisenji Temple, where intricate carvings decorate one of Japan's finest examples of wood-carved temple architecture.		
			In the afternoon, your minibus winds into the mountains toward Gokayama, a UNESCO World Heritage-listed village famous for its gassho-zukuri farmhouses - steep thatched-roof homes built to withstand the region's heavy snowfalls. Tonight, stay in one of these preserved, original homes and experience true Japanese rural hospitality.		
			Dinner is a home-style Japanese meal, prepared with local ingredients and shared in the cosy, communal setting of the farmhouse.		
			Please note: Rooms are private, but bathroom facilities are shared in traditional style. The authentic atmosphere and warm local hospitality more than make up for the simplicity of the accommodation.

			Upon arrival, embark on a guided tour of Kanazawa, a beautifully preserved city with deep roots in samural heritage and Edo-period prosperity. Once a wealthy castle town under the rule of the Maeda clan, Kanazawa is rich in cultural legacy and architectural elegance.		
			The city boasts an exceptional collection of historic districts, artisan workshops, and cultural landmarks. A highlight of your visit is Kenrokuen Garden, often regarded as one of the three most beautiful gardens in Japan, renowned for its harmonious design, seasonal beauty, and tranquil atmosphere.		
			This evening, indulge in a premium wagyu beef teppanyaki dinner, where your meal is expertly prepared in front of you by a skilled chef - an entertaining and delicious way to end the day.

			The afternoon and evening are free for you to explore Kanazawa at your own pace. A highly recommended option is a visit to the Higashi Chaya Geisha District, where beautifully preserved teahouses and traditional wooden facades transport you to a bygone era. Step inside a historic teahouse, enjoy a cup of matcha, or browse exquisite handcrafted souvenirs.		
			Kanazawa is also a celebrated centre for traditional Japanese arts and crafts. You may wish to visit local galleries or artisan workshops featuring:		
			 - Kaga Yuzen - delicately hand-dyed kimono textiles, - Kutaniyaki - vividly coloured porcelain unique to the region, and - Wajima-nuri lacquerware - elegant, durable pieces made with centuries-old techniques. 		
			The city's boutique shops, craft studios, and modern museums offer a perfect blend of old and new for culturally curious visitors.		
			For dinner, you might like to try one of Kanazawa's refined restaurants featuring regional Kaga cuisine, sushi, or creative interpretations of local seafood and mountain vegetables.

			Tonight, you will stay at a shukubo - a temple lodging where pilgrims have rested for centuries. Here, you can experience authentic Buddhist vegetarian meals for dinner and breakfast, prepared with seasonal ingredients, and (optionally) participate in the unforgettable early morning meditation service at Eihei-ji, a moving spiritual experience available exclusively to guests.		
11	Fri 20/11/2026	Guided tour of Fukui and transfer to Kyoto	This morning, journey deeper into the sacred mountains to a tranquil temple nestled in a remote mountain hamlet. Here, you will have the rare opportunity to participate in a Buddhist meditation session, experiencing firsthand the serene practice that has been part of Japan's spiritual tradition for centuries.	Breakfast, Dinner	The Royal Park Hotel Kyoto Sanjo [Deluxe Twin]
			After a peaceful lunch, travel by private minibus to the city of Echizen, renowned for its exceptional knife-making heritage. Visit a longestablished local knife factory where you will watch skilled artisans forge razor-sharp blades using traditional methods handed down through generations.		
			In the afternoon, board an express train to Kyoto, Japan's cultural heart. Upon arrival, take a guided stroll through the atmospheric streets of Gion, famous for its historic architecture, teahouses, and geisha culture.		
			Tonight, gather for your "Farewell Japan" dinner, a special meal to celebrate the memories and friendships forged during your remarkable journey.
