2	Guided tour of Tokyo	<p>Your first full day in Tokyo begins with a gentle orientation by your expert Journey to the East guide, offering insights into the city's history, culture, and the rhythms of daily life in Japan's vibrant capital.</p> <p>Your morning takes you to Asakusa, one of Tokyo's oldest and best-preserved districts. Here, thatched-roof farmhouses, artisan workshops, and gentle rural scenery offer a peaceful look into traditional life at the foot of Mt Fuji.</p> <p>In the afternoon, you board a train back to Tokyo, gliding once again through scenic countryside as you return to the heart of Japan's bustling capital.
