Hakata has long been celebrated for its rich culture, traditional crafts, and, of course, its world-famous Hakata ramen - thin, firm noodles in a rich pork-bone broth.</p> <p>Stop at a classic Hakata ramen restaurant for lunch and discover firsthand why locals are so passionate about their noodles. Roll up your sleeves and prepare a selection of dishes under her guidance - an experience designed to be both fun and educational, leaving you confident to recreate these flavours at home.</p> <p>Next, travel to the neighbouring town of Dazaifu to visit the magnificent Tenmangu Shrine, dedicated to the 9th-century scholar revered as the god of literature and learning. The shrine's elegant architecture and serene grounds provide a fascinating insight into Japan's cultural heritage.</p> <p>Return to Fukuoka in the evening for a taste of authentic local life at the city's legendary Yatai food stalls. Travel by private transport to a local tea producer to learn about the different grades and varieties of Japanese green tea, and enjoy a stunning mountain-top view of the rolling emerald tea fields, perfect for photography and quiet reflection. Next, visit Kyushu's oldest tea merchant, established in 1865, where an expert prepares a cup of gyokuro, Japan's finest tea - a true highlight for tea enthusiasts.</p> <p>After lunch, discover another iconic Japanese beverage with a visit to an award-winning local sake brewery. Enjoy a private tour of the production facilities, followed by a sake tasting and an opportunity to speak directly with the brewers about their techniques and styles.</p> <p>Return to Fukuoka for a free evening to explore the city's renowned culinary scene. 7	Guided tour of Arita and Imari	<p>Today, you explore Kyushu's celebrated ceramic towns of Arita and Imari, travelling by private vehicle from Karatsu. These towns, along with Karatsu, have produced porcelain that was highly prized both in Japan and Europe for centuries, and continues to be sought after by collectors, chefs, and restaurateurs worldwide.</p> <p>In Arita, discover the intricately coloured Arita-ware, known for its delicate hand-painted designs and refined porcelain craftsmanship. In Imari, witness artisans creating the classic blue-and-white Imari-ware, renowned for its bold patterns and timeless elegance. Visit a ceramics museum, a traditional pottery village, and an active kiln to see master potters at work. Lunch is a special treat, served in authentic Arita porcelain, allowing you to experience firsthand the artistry that elevates Japanese cuisine.</p> <p>After an inspiring day immersed in Japanese ceramic traditions, continue to the picturesque harbour city of Nagasaki, where you can enjoy a relaxing free evening to wander, dine, or simply soak in the city's atmosphere.</p>	Breakfast, Lunch	Nagasaki Marriott Hotel [Double/Twin]
8	Guided tour of Nagasaki	<p>Nagasaki was the only part of Japan open to foreign trade during the 17th and 18th centuries, attracting Asian and European merchants and missionaries. This cosmopolitan heritage is still evident today in the city's architecture, culture, and cuisine.</p> <p>Explore Nagasaki by the city's iconic streetcar, beginning with visits to the Peace Park and Atomic Bomb Museum, solemn reminders of the events of August 1945. Continue to Dejima, an open-air museum showcasing Nagasaki's historic role as Japan's window to the world.</p> <p>After a free afternoon, experience a unique Nagasaki culinary tradition with dinner featuring Shippoku cuisine, a historic fusion of Japanese, Chinese, and European (primarily Dutch) flavours - reflecting the city's rich history of cultural exchange and trade.</p>	Breakfast, Dinner	Nagasaki Marriott Hotel [Double/Twin]
9	Guided tour of Nagasaki and Unzen	<p>Today's focus is on Nagasaki's rich fisheries. Visit a local fish farm to learn how Japan maintains its seafood industry sustainably, gaining insight into the practices that support both the local economy and the environment.</p> <p>For lunch, enjoy Champon noodles, a beloved Nagasaki specialty combining fresh seafood, vegetables, and noodles in a hearty, flavourful broth.</p> <p>In the afternoon, journey to the Shimabara Peninsula, a historic and geologically unique region of Kyushu. Your destination is the onsen town of Unzen, nestled within the breathtaking Unzen-Amakusa National Park, famous for its volcanic landscapes. Check in to one of Unzen's onsen hotels and relax in its rejuvenating mineral baths - an ideal way to unwind after a day of travel and exploration.</p>	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner	Unzen Kyushu Hotel [Terrace Premier Double/Twin]

10	Guided tour of Unzen and Shimabara	<p>Begin the day with a stroll to Unzen’s bubbling jigoku, or “hells,” where geothermal hot springs create a dramatic landscape unique to the region. Travel by private vehicle along the scenic Nita-Toge Pass, offering spectacular views across the bay toward Kumamoto on clear days.</p> <p>Explore Shimabara Castle, surrounded by a forest of cherry blossoms, and visit the area’s former samurai residences. Stop at the Mt Unzen Eruption Preservation Park to see the buried houses, a vivid reminder of the 1991 eruption. Later, board a ferry to Kumamoto, enjoying the coastal scenery along the way.</p> <p>Dinner tonight is at a charming Italian-style restaurant, where an Italian-trained chef creatively showcases heritage Kumamoto vegetables with a Japanese twist - a treat for food enthusiasts and a perfect introduction to the region’s innovative culinary scene.</p>	Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner	Hotel Nikko Kumamoto [Western style room]
11	Guided tour of Kumamoto	<p>This morning, enjoy a guided tour of Kumamoto Castle, one of Japan’s most iconic castles. Originally built in 1607, the castle suffered damage during the 2016 earthquake and is still undergoing restoration, offering a fascinating glimpse into Japan’s preservation efforts. The castle’s massive stone walls and beautifully manicured grounds are home to some of Japan’s most spectacular cherry blossom trees.</p> <p>Next, visit Suizenji Japanese Garden, created for the powerful clan that once ruled Kumamoto. Its carefully designed landscapes reflect centuries of Japanese horticultural artistry.</p> <p>The afternoon is free to explore Kumamoto at your own pace. Browse its selection of modern shops, or enjoy a meal at one of the city’s many restaurants - ranging from traditional Japanese to international cuisine. 12	Guided tour of Mt Aso	<p>Today, you travel through one of Kyushu’s most spectacular landscapes: the volcanic caldera of Mt Aso. Stop at scenic vantage points to appreciate the vast scale of the caldera and witness the dramatic, ever-changing nature of this active volcano.</p> <p>Experience a taste of Japan’s emerging winemaking scene with a visit to a local vineyard, sampling wines crafted from Kyushu-grown grapes - a delightful introduction to this growing industry.</p> <p>Tonight, unwind at a charming boutique onsen hotel nestled in nature.
